Dear Transplant recipient:

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that moderately to severely immunocompromised people who previously received the COVID-19 Pfizer or Moderna vaccine, should receive an additional dose. This recommendation includes organ transplant recipients. UCSF Transplant strongly encourages those who received the mRNA (Pfizer or Moderna) COVID-19 vaccine to get an additional dose.

***\*\*Please note. The additional dose of the vaccine must be one administered according to age-eligible requirements. If the transplant recipient is between the ages of 12-17 years old, they should receive the Pfizer vaccine as a third dose. If the transplant recipient is 18 or older, they should receive either the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine as a third dose.***

The additional dose should be given at least 4 weeks after the second dose of mRNA vaccine.

Transplant recipients can get the additional vaccine at their local vaccination site. They do not need a note from their transplant provider.

At this time, there is no recommendation from the CDC regarding an additional dose for patients who have received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. We are awaiting further information from CDC about patients who have received the J&J vaccine.
